GENERAL INFORMATION

- * Battalion Chief Chuck Carver is retiring but will work back under contract for approximately twelve months. The Department appreciates his many years of dedicated service to the community and the district.
- * The Weed Abatement hotline, the Fire Chief, the Mayor, and the Council have received numerous complaints about weeds, tall grass, and other vegetation and debris along the railroad right of way owned by Vennell Farms Rail Company (VFRC). That property is not within the Fire Department's jurisdiction; therefore, the Department cannot order abatement. However, due to the tenacity of all involved, VFRC has agreed to hire a surveyor to determine the property boundaries along the rail line. Due to the potential for civil liability, VFRC intends to clear the entire 60-foot width of RR right of way, 30 feet on each side of the half-mile stretch north of Wake Robin Avenue, as soon as practicable. It is possible that during this clearing process, fencing that has been built within the rail right of way will be removed.
