Current Level of Staffing

- Residents: 8
- Community Volunteers: 1
- Currently, we have 4 Crew Leaders, 4 Apparatus Operators, and 1 Firefighter/AO in training. Additionally, 3 are Tender operators.
- 7 of the RRVs are state licensed EMTs
- Congrats to CV Tony O'Donahue for passing his state practical EMT test!

- CV O'Donahue is still making steady progress working through the Apparatus Operator Training Program. Checked off to drive engine.
- Nick Pozzesi and Cole Schneider are close to completing the Tender Operator Training Program and have started the Crew Leader Training Program.
- Pozzesi, Sankovitz, and Ketelson will be starting Paramedic School at Chemeketa in April.
- Five of the RRVs who are EMTs are working through the process to obtain their Standing Orders.
- Staff anticipates numerous vacancies being created through 2017/2018 as a result of regional hiring.
- Bobby Crowston will be resigning shortly and pursuing a career as an electrician.
- Dalton Brown and Mathias Austin have recently changed assignment from Station 6 RRV to Station 1 RV to better accommodate their career goals and skill sets.
- A number of current RVs and a number of current Academy Recruits have expressed interest in the RRV Program. Lt will be assessing the best fits for the Program over the upcoming month.
