Information Sharing

- Thus far in 2017, current Residents have completed 1621 hours of training.

Current Level of Staffing

- Residents: 10
- Community Volunteers: 0
- Currently, we have 4 Crew Leaders, 4 Apparatus Operators, and 2 Firefighters/AOs in training. Additionally, 7 are Tender operators.
- Staff anticipates numerous vacancies being created through 2017 as a result of regional hirings and other factors.
- Pozzesi and Schneider are close to completing AO Training Program.
- Fall Academy should yield 3 new RRVs.

Pending Proposals

- Parking Lot Seal and Paint Lines – resubmitted from last summer. The lines are nearly indecipherable and the parking lot is long overdue to be sealed. Staff recommends approval to schedule for the summer. Staff also recommends concurrently repainting the basketball court lines, which are used often.
- Resident Kidd has formulated a Scholarship Program Proposal for the Board's consideration. Kidd met with Conder this last week and discussed Kidd presenting to the Board. Kidd will attend June Board Meeting.

Special Notes

- Field WAS mowed late May by Jim Hedlund. Will need mowing again in July.
- Thermostats have been set to Cool at 72 and Heat at 64.
- Staff consulted with BC Shops regarding the idea of bolting weight room gear to the slab. BC Shops does not provide this service, and Staff recommends NOT bolting the equipment down, as the newer gear is very stable and equipment mobility is desirable.
- Residents hosted FPA Ashland's WUI event and provided a demonstration of Mobile Attack, Progressive Hose Lay, Water Tender Operations, and Brush Truck Operations.
- Residents deep cleaned the bike storage room and repainted it.
